Closing Remarks

Alix Bryant (2014) - Soccer / Basketball / Outdoor Track

Upon her enrollment at Salem High School, Alix's impact was immediate and significant. She started as a Freshman in both soccer and basketball. A defensive specialist: Alix's defensive prowess put the opposing offense on notice. Unlike the offensive side of the field and court, records are not often kept for defensive efforts; however, her efforts were recognized by way of the number of awards and recognition that she received. Some of the awards include: Numerous NEC All Stars, Salem News All Star, Eastern Mass Girls Soccer Coaches Association All Star, All State Honorable Mention, an invitation to play in the Agganis Game, and named to the Salem News All-Decade Team. Alix also received an athletic scholarship to play Division I soccer at the University of Hartford. Alix was not just a gifted athlete in soccer and basketball; she was also a leader - as evidenced by being named a captain in both sports during her Sophomore year. Alix also excelled in the classroom, as she was an honors student and part of the National Honor Society. As an elite athlete, leader, and scholar, Alix was the type of student that schools and communities should be proud of. She represented Salem High School in all three phases at the highest level.

Jessica Corneau (2007) - Gymnastics / Outdoor Track

As a four year member of the Witches gymnastics team, Jessica was a standout competing as an All-Around gymnast. Her high level skills and consistency in leadership led to many team wins, contributing both as a gymnast and captain. This was exemplified by her earning an NEC All-Star on Vault and qualifying multiple times for the Massachusetts State Individuals Gymnastics Championships as an All-Around competitor. Jessica continually proved her value scoring in the mid to high 9s, allowing her team to achieve many wins in the Northeastern Conference and the Cape Ann League. Her high school career culminated with her representing Salem High as a member of the Massachusetts National High School Gymnastics team. This would earn Jessica the distinct honor of being named an All-American on Bars, Beam and Floor.

Edwin Demoya (2011) - Soccer

Edwin Demoya's time at Salem High School was defined by passion, leadership, and an unmatched dedication to the game. From the first time he stepped onto the field, it was clear that Edwin possessed a natural talent that made him one of the most dynamic strikers in program history. A two-year captain, Edwin became the cornerstone of Salem's offense, leading the Witches to some of their most successful seasons of the decade. His Senior year was the pinnacle of his high school career, recording 26 goals and 10 assists and finishing with an incredible 89 goals and 38 assists overall — the most points in Salem High School history. His performance and leadership earned him numerous honors, including Northeastern Conference MVP, Eastern Massachusetts All-Star, All-State, and All-New England recognition. He was also named Division 2 All-Star MVP and received Salem High's Hall of Fame and team MVP awards. His legacy was further cemented when he was named to the Salem News All-Decade Team, recognizing him as one of the region's top players of the 2000s. Beyond the accolades, Edwin was respected for his humility, discipline, and team-first mentality. After graduation, enlisted in the United States Navy, where he proudly serves as a Master-at-Arms.

Joseph Fabiano (1994) - Football / Hockey / Baseball

Joe was a Football, Hockey, and Baseball player all four years at Salem High School. He was a two-sport captain his Senior year for Football and Hockey. Joe broke several records playing football. Most notably, he broke the career scoring record that was set in 1963. In Joe's Senior Year in 1993 he became the career leader with 30 touchdowns and 194 points. He was named Salem News All-Star his Junior and Senior Year, NEC All-Conference, Lynn Item All-Star, and Channel 3 All-Star. He was named Team Offensive MVP Junior and Senior year. He played in the Agganis All-Star Game, scoring two touchdowns and a 2-point conversion. Joe was a two year starter at 3rd base for Salem High's baseball team. He batted 0.338 his Junior Year and 0.384 his Senior year. He was a Salem news All Star for Baseball. He also began playing hockey as a Freshman. He was the team's leading scorer his Senior Year, and was selected as an NEC All-Star and played in the All-Star Game too. Joe has been working for Mass General Brigham-Salem Hospital as an MRI Technologist for the last 25 years.

Joseph Freeman (1995) - Football / Indoor Track / Outdoor Track

Joseph Freeman played football and competed in track all four years. He finished with a combined 27-0 record in Conference competition across three sports, serving as captain of all three teams. In Football, he was a starting running back and cornerback, and was elected Captain his Senior year and helped lead the Varsity football team to a 9-0 record within the NEC Conference and a NEC Conference Championship. Joseph triumphed as a Track and Field standout, forming one half of the "Salem Duo"- along with fellow Hall of Fame inductee, Jamal Mercado. As a Senior Captain, he helped lead the team to a perfect 9-0 record and an NEC Championship. Joseph is a 2-time NEC Track and Field All-Star, 2-time NEC Conference High Jump Champion, lead runner of a 2-time NEC Conference Champion 4x100 relay team, 2-time Salem High School Track and Field MVP, and a NEC Conference Champion in 110 high hurdles. He finished his Salem High School career as a school record holder in the indoor 50 high hurdles, outdoor 110 High hurdles, and outdoor High jump. Continuing his Track and Field career at Westfield State University (College), Joseph shined as a member of the three-time MASCAC (Massachusetts State Collegiate Athletic Conference) Championship team. At WSC, he earned the Outstanding Contributor Award twice (1997, 1999), became a 2-time Mass State Conference Champion in the 110 High hurdles, won a MASCAC title in the triple jump, and claimed the New England Alliance Champion on the 110 high hurdles.

Brian Lockard (1978) - Cross Country / Indoor Track / Outdoor Track

Brian participated in Cross Country and Track all four years of his high school career and was elected captain of the 1978 Spring Track Team. His accomplishments include: Member of the 1977 team (# 2 runner) that won the Massachusetts All-State Cross Country Championship, two Eastern Mass Division 2 championships, three Northeastern Conference championships, and the 1977 Mass/Conn meet. Brian was also the 1978 Northeastern Conference 2-mile Spring Track champion and the 1978 2-mile winner vs Beverly in the final event to ensure a first-time victory over our biggest conference rival in Spring Track. Brian holds Salem High's fourth fastest Cross Country time (13:34) on the Salem High Gallows Hill course and the second fastest 2-mile time (9:34). After high school, Brian attended UMass, Dartmouth and continued his running career. He qualified for 8 national championships, four each in Cross Country and Track, and earned All- American status in Cross Country during the 1980 season. For these efforts, Brian was inducted into the UMass Dartmouth Athletic Hall of Fame.

Jared Louf Woods (2013) - Football / Basketball / Outdoor Track

A dedicated competitor across multiple sports, Jared made his mark in football, basketball, and track and field during his four years as a Witch. Throughout his career, Jared earned more Unsung Hero and Coaches Awards than MVPs—recognition that spoke volumes about his unselfishness, leadership, and willingness to do whatever his teams needed to succeed. By his Junior and Senior years, Jared was a three-season Varsity athlete, excelling in football, basketball, and spring track. His leadership and determination earned him the honor of serving as captain for both the Varsity Football and Spring Track teams during the 2012–2013 school year. In the fall of 2012, Jared’s performance on the gridiron earned him recognition as a Salem News All-Star and selection to the Agganis All-Star Football Game. He was also named a Salem News All-Star for basketball. During the spring of 2013, Jared turned his focus to track and field, where he broke the school record in the shot put with an impressive throw of 50 feet, 8 inches. After graduating, Jared continued his athletic career in football and track at UMass Dartmouth. Jared competed in the indoor shot put, outdoor shot put, indoor weight throw, and outdoor hammer throw, breaking the university’s school records in each event. While competing in the Little East Conference, Jared captured ten individual conference titles and qualified for the NCAA Championships. His outstanding performances earned him three NCAA All-American honors. Following his graduation, Jared pursued a career in law enforcement and now proudly serves the UMass Dartmouth community as a police officer.

Jamal Mercado (1995) - Football / Indoor Track / Outdoor Track

Jamal Mercado was a four-year football athlete as well as a three-year Indoor Track and Field and four-year Outdoor Track and Field standout. He finished with a combined 27-0 record in Conference competitions across the three sports, highlighted by achieving three NEC Championships his Senior year, as well as a trip to the Superbowl. During the 1994 football season, Jamal contributed to the Witches perfect 9-0 run in Conference play, winning an NEC Championship and becoming Super Bowl Runner-Ups. Jamal excelled as a Track and Field phenom, consistently sharing the headlines with fellow Hall of Fame Inductee, Joseph Freeman - collectively known as the “Salem Duo”. During his Senior year in Indoor Track, Jamal became a leader of another undefeated team (9-0) and went on to win the NEC Championship. Jamal was a two-time Salem News All-Star, Lynn Item All-Star, two-time NEC 4x100 M Relay Champion, NEC 200 M Champion, and NEC MVP. He still holds several impressive records as well, including the NEC Indoor High Jump (6' 7½") along with the Salem High School records for: Indoor High Jump (6' 7½") Indoor 50 Yard Dash (5.5 Seconds, tied for record), Spring Track Triple Jump (44' 10"), 200 M (22.8 Seconds) and 100 M (10.8 Seconds). For all of these achievements and more, Jamal was awarded the Salem High School MVP in 1994 as well as the Salem High School Career Achievement Award in 1995.

Hannah Mullarkey (2014) - Volleyball

Hannah was a four-year Varsity Volleyball starter and two-time captain at Salem High. A defensive stalwart Hannah anchored the back court for the Witches as libero before proving her all-around play as an outside hitter her Senior year. As a two time captain, Hannah's leadership propelled the Witches to their winningest season in history in 2013, an NEC championship in 2011, and MIAA tournament berths 3 of 4 seasons. Hannah's defensive aptitude puts her at the top of the stat sheets with 516 digs and a 2.3 serve reception rating. Hannah also holds the program record for aces (234) and is tied for second in sets played (281). Hannah was selected to the NEC All-Conference team four times and she was named Witches Volleyball Player of the Year in 2013. Following her time at Salem High, Hannah went on to earn a degree in Nursing as well as play for the Salem State Vikings where she continued to excel athletically, surpassing the 1000+ dig mark and holding the program record for career digs. Aside from working as a registered nurse in Boston, Hannah remains an integral part of the youth volleyball community, working as an Assistant Director of Avidity Volleyball Club in Danvers and an assistant coach at Marblehead High School. Hannah's knowledge, love, and passion for the game is palpable as she works to continue growing the sport in the region, and give female athletes the tools to succeed not only in the sport but in life.

Sarah Mullarkey (2011) - Volleyball

Sarah was a four-year Varsity Volleyball standout and a founding member of Salem High School's inaugural volleyball team in 2007. Serving as the team's primary setter for her entire high school career, and as captain for three of her four seasons, Sarah's leadership and knowledge of the sport was instrumental in guiding a brand new team from its earliest practices to competitive success. Just four years after the program's inception, during Sarah's Senior season, the Witches achieved the milestone of earning their first MIAA tournament berth in 2010. Sarah's commanding court presence and leadership were undeniable. Her skill, consistency, and competitive drive earned her both Salem News and NEC All-Star recognitions consistently throughout her high school career. Sarah was also named Witches Volleyball Player of the Year for three consecutive seasons. Following her high school career, Sarah continued to play volleyball at Bridgewater State University, where she was a four-year starter and Senior Captain for the Bears. Over her collegiate career, she amassed 932 digs, 391 assists, and 224 kills, demonstrating her versatility and value as a key all-around player. Sarah earned her Bachelor's Degree in Health Resources Management in 2015 and has since built a career in patient advocacy. Sarah's contributions to volleyball have extended beyond her playing years. She has remained deeply involved in the sport as she's coached with Avidity Volleyball Club, Beantown Volleyball Club, assistant coach at Marblehead High School, and served as Head Coach at Salem Academy Charter School in 2021. She continues to play both indoor and beach volleyball and remains an avid fan of the game - exemplifying the same passion for volleyball that defined her from the start.

Richard "Rick" O'Leary (1988) - Football / Baseball

Rick O'Leary's career at Salem High was remarkable not just for the numbers, but for the impact he had on two programs that came to define excellence at our school. On the football field, Rick was a three-year Varsity starter — serving as the team's quarterback in 1986 and 1987 and also handling the kicking duties for three straight seasons. In 1986, he led Salem to the NEC Championship. At the time of his graduation, Rick's held records for most career field goals, longest touchdown pass in a game, most extra points in a season and in a career, and he was tied for the most defensive interceptions in a game. A three-year Varsity starter for Salem High baseball, Rick began his career at second base as a Sophomore before moving to shortstop for his final two seasons. In 1987, with Rick anchoring the infield, Salem returned to the state tournament for the first time in over a decade. The following year, the Witches captured the NEC Championship. During his Senior year, Rick was named an NEC All-Star, a Salem News All-Star, a Boston Globe All-Star, and an Eastern Mass All-Star. That spring, the Witches went 18-4, and Rick led the way — batting .446 with 13 extra-base hits, including 6 home runs and 28 RBIs. He drew 15 walks, struck out only four times all season, and finished his career with a batting average over .340. And when his team needed him on the mound, he was there too — picking up key wins as both a Junior and Senior. Over his three varsity seasons, Salem baseball won more than 50 games — and Rick's leadership, consistency, and clutch play were a big reason why. Rick continues to give back to the Salem High School community by serving as our Head Softball Coach.

Beau Theriault (2008) - Golf / Basketball / Baseball

A three-sport athlete in golf, basketball, and baseball, Beau never sought the spotlight—he earned it through effort, teamwork, and a deep respect for doing the simple things well. On the golf course, Beau was the definition of steady. He didn't rely on flashy drives or risky shots; instead, he built his game around consistency, keeping the ball in play and letting precision speak louder than power. On the basketball court, Beau was a selfless teammate who took more pride in assists than points. His defensive tenacity and court awareness made him a coach's dream—always in the right place, always making the smart play. And on the baseball diamond, Beau found his true joy at shortstop. His love for the game was evident in every play, and his leadership helped anchor the team through countless innings. Today, Beau continues to make a lasting impact on Salem Athletics through his unwavering commitment to coaching and mentoring young athletes—including his own children, who have followed in his footsteps by participating in golf, soccer, basketball, baseball, and softball. Beau has coached it all, always with the same passion and emphasis on fundamentals that defined his own playing days. His dedication extends beyond his family, as he takes pride in helping all Salem kids grow both on and off the field, shaping the next generation of athletes with the same values that earned him a place in the Hall of Fame. Beau Theriault's legacy at Salem High is one of quiet strength, selfless leadership, and a lifelong devotion to the games he loves.

Paul Tucker (1976) - Cross Country / Indoor Track / Outdoor Track

Paul Tucker was a four-year Cross Country and Track & Field athlete at SHS. As a Cross Country performer, he was part of the team's unprecedented success under Coach Dave Dunsky. Paul captained the 1975 team that went undefeated and won the Northeastern Conference Championship. For his leadership and performance, the coaches honored Paul with the Cross Country Hall of Fame Award. Paul was a multi-event athlete for three years in Winter Track and four years on Spring Track teams. He was consistently among the top point scorers and was the top scorer on the Spring Track team during his Senior year, competing in the 400 and 800 meter races and the high jump, and running the anchor leg of the mile relay. At the Spring 1976 Northeastern Conference Championship meet, Paul won the 800 meter race and was the Conference Champion. He was also named team MVP and received his second Hall of Fame Award. Following his graduation, Paul had a 32-year career in the Salem Police Department, most of which assigned as the Chief of Detectives before becoming the police chief. He was then elected as State Representative serving in that position for 8 years. He then ran for Essex County District Attorney and was elected and continues to serve the citizens of Essex County.

Melikke Van Alstyne Jr. (2009) - Football / Track

A passionate three-year starter and Senior Captain of the Salem High School football team, Melikke truly exemplified leadership and determination. He achieved over 1,000 rushing yards in three consecutive seasons and etched his name into the record books with a total of 3,853 rushing yards and 42 touchdowns. Taking his love for football to new heights, Melikke brought his talents to Framingham State University, where he made an unforgettable impact on the program. He broke records for rushing yards in a game, season, and career, finishing with an impressive 6,145 yards and 67 touchdowns. His remarkable accomplishments earned him numerous accolades, including three consecutive NEFC Bogan Division Offensive Player of the Year awards, multiple All-New England selections, four MASCAC championships, and two NCAA tournament appearances. His contributions to the sport culminated in his well-deserved induction into the Framingham State University Hall of Fame earlier in 2025.

Salem High School Hall of Fame

To be inducted into the Hall of Fame, the nominees must be voted in by the Hall of Fame Committee and must fit the requirements for one of the following categories:

Coach, Teacher or Administrator: must have at least two years of service in the Salem school system and must have made significant contributions to the athletic tradition and to the programs in the Salem Athletic Department.

Meritorious Service: must be an individual or individuals who have volunteered unselfishly of their time and effort which resulted in supporting the programs and student-athletes at Salem High.

Athletic Participation: must have contributed significantly to the athletic tradition at Salem High such as making outstanding contributions to a team, setting records, or leading a team to a championship.
