The 21st annual Salem High School Athletic Hall of Fame banquet took place Tuesday night at Veterans Memorial Fieldhouse, where 14 former greats were inducted and at least 10 times as many stories shared.

Three Former Witches on NCAA Rosters This Winter

Junior **Amayah McConney** '23 has emerged a starter on Salem State's women's basketball team and has put together averages of 7.6 points and 5.7 rebounds. Ms. McConney has enjoyed season highs of 13 points in losses to Johnson & Wales (76-51) and Emerson College (68-57) and 13 rebounds in a 58-55 win over Nichols College.



Andrea Bertini '92, in her 21st season as the Westfield State
University women's basketball coach, has the Owls off to a 7-3 start this season. The Owls won five of their first six games before going 2-2 in December, highlighting with a 75-54 win over Rivier University and a 74-70 win over Sage College.

Miguel Arcila '25, a freshman on the Bridgewater State University wrestling team, earned his first collegiate win Nov. 8 at the Roger Williams Invitational with a 6-2 win over Gavin McKenna of Roger Williams in the 149-pound weight class. Most recently, Mr. Arcila went 2-2 at the Messiah Petrofes Invitational Dec. 5-6 with wins over Seamus Harnett (22-6) of Springfield College and Horatio Bowen (8-3) of Averett College. At the Roger Williams Scott Viera Open Dec. 13, Mr. Arcila went 1-2, highlighting with a 25-10 decision over Tanner Kamuda of New England College.

Former Witches Lead Curry Football, Enjoy Successful Fall Season

The Curry College football team improved from 4-6 in 2024 to 8-3 in 2025 with the help of four former witches: sophomores **Shane Field**, **Eli Vasquez-Bastardo**, **Albert Pujolz** and freshman **Javien Ramos**. Named to the All-Conference New England Second Team, Mr. Field led the Colonels

with 86 tackles (58 solo, 26 assisted, 10 for loss) while Mr. Vasquez-Bastardo added 42 (23-19) and Mr. Pujolz 34 (19-15). Mr. Ramos saw action in three games.

Senior **Presley Shairs '22** led the Salem State women's volleyball team in blocks this season with 40 (20 solo), along with 2.8 kills per set as the Vikings went 10-15 overall and 3-5 in the MASCAC. Ms. Shairs highlighted her senior season with a season-high 16 kills and four blocks in a 3-1 win over Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts.

Samantha Agno '25 enjoyed a stellar freshman season with the

Salem State women's soccer team this fall as she scored two goals in 17 appearances (one start). The Vikings went 8-7-3 overall (4-4-0 in the MASCAC), and ended the season with a 3-2 shootout loss following a 1-1 deadlock against Framingham State in the MASCAC Tournament quarterfinal...**Chris Qirjazi '23**, a junior on the Saint Michael's College men's soccer team, saw action in nine matches with one start for the Purple Knights, which recently capped their season at 8-6-3 overall and 4-3-2 in the rigorous Northeast-10 Conference. Mr. Qirjazi scored one goal in a 7-0 victory over Daemen College.

Junior Isabella Cunha '23 saw action in 10 games this season for the Wentworth Institute of Technology women's soccer team, which finished the year 7-5-7 overall and 2-5-3 in Conference New England. Ms. Cunha chipped in one goal and two assists this season...Sophomore Walbee Pierre '22 started six of 13 matches for the Framingham State University men's soccer team this season after transferring from Dean College. The Rams struggled to 5-10-3 overall and 2-6-0 in the MASCAC...Sophomore Malcolm Edwards '24 made 10 starts in net with the Fitchburg State University men's soccer team, which went 4-10-4 overall and 1-4-3 in the MASCAC...Junior Jonathan Wasserman '23 highlighted the fall with an 81 to help the Worcester State golf team place fifth (among seven teams) at the Westfield State Brett Williamson Invitational Sept. 23.

Property Maintenance. Jayden Bueno '25, in his first year as an accelerated service technician at Acura Peabody, completed the 12week Automotive Technology course with perfect attendance and served as the ceremony's guest speaker. He joined SHS alumni Alex Cepeda, Robert Santana Pena, and Aiden Nelson in the automotive cohort while Brandon Caliri '13 completed the STI Building and Property Maintenance 12-week course.



Rhianna (Jones) Hampton '13, a lab analyst at Duke Surgery in Raleigh, N.C, recently published 'Functional Reprogramming of Peripheral Eosinophils in Lentivirus-Infected Rhesus Macagues' for research that her lab has conducted for infectious disease and immunology at Duke University. Ms. Hampton's paper focuses on eosinophils and a new technique for understanding and isolating them.

Nany Medrano '19 continues to make her mark in the community and in cheerleading, currently serving as the coach for Salem Youth Cheerleading as well as the Salem High School Cheer team, where her own journey began. In 2023, Ms. Medrano became the first coach in Salem history to bring her Salem Youth Cheerleading team to nationals in Orlando, Florida, prior to which it achieved first place finishes at State and Regional Championships before earning the opportunity to compete on the national stage. In addition to coaching, Nany continues to pursue her own athletic career as a member of the NSE Level 4 cheer team, which competes at the World Cheerleading Competition at the ESPN Wide World of Sports Center.
